

## Soft plastic recycling

UNSW Kensington campus has dedicated soft plastic recycling bins. These orange bins are collected by <u>Cleanaway</u> weekly and taken to specialist recycling facilities for sorting and baling.

## What goes in the orange bins?

Use the bins to recycle <u>clear</u> soft plastic that passes the <u>scrunch test</u>. This means any plastic packaging that is transparent, colourless and can be easily squeezed into a ball in your hand goes into the orange bin.

These soft plastics include:

- Low-density polyethylene (LDPE):
  - Pallet wrap
  - Shrink wrap
  - Stretch wrap
- Bubble wrap
- Air pillows
- Plastic bags







## How to effectively recycle soft plastic:

- 1. Collect clear soft plastic at a central location in your office, lab or workshop.
- 2. If needed, you can collect clear plastic bin liners from upper and lower campus Stores.
- 3. Once full, deposit your <u>clear</u> soft plastic into an orange bin at one of the following locations on campus:
  - E8 Science & Engineering Building (Lower Campus Store)
  - E26 Biological Sciences (Upper Campus Store)



Note: Do not move the orange bins, they are purely a drop off point for soft plastics and should not be taken with you.
